# Departments Of Mathematics

**Description** This course is aimed at students who intend to pursue a degree in Mathematics,

Applied Mathematics, Physics, Astronomy, Statistics, or Actuarial Sciences. Topics include: The Mean Value Theorem, techniques of integration, sequences and series,

differential equations, parametric equations, and polar curves.

Prerequisites\* A minimum mark of 60% in one of Calculus 1000A or Calculus 1500A

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**Textbook** Required are Single Variable Calculus: Early Transcendentals, 7th Ed., by James

Stewart (Brooks/Cole), along with the *Student's Solution Manual*. This is the same textbook that was used for Calculus 1000A in the fall and winter terms. Text and

solutions were sold together as the "Student Value Package."

**Reading** At a minimum, students are expected to read the textbook and complete the exercises

suggested on the course website. The topics we deal with in this course come from Chapters 4, 7-11 (not necessarily in that order). Students should consult the list of

suggested exercises on the course website for more detail.

**Course Notes** Some topics will be covered in more detail than is available in the textbook. For these

topics students are expected to consult the supplementary course notes available for

free on the course website.

#### **Quiz/Assignment Marks**

Quizzes, consisting of three problems, will be given 3-4 times per week, usually at the end of the class. Quizzes are multiple choice, but there is a penalty of one point for each incorrect answer. If the question is left unanswered, it is worth 0 points. The maximum score attained is 12 points. To avoid negative scores, each student begins with 3 points. Hence, the minimum score attainable is 0 points.

Although the use of calculators will not be permitted during quizzes and exams, students are expected to have a reasonable facility in the use of their calculators.
