CALCULUS 1501B SECTION 002 – WINTER 2013

DEPARTMENTS OF MATHEMATICS AND APPLIED MATHEMATICS

Description	This course is aimed at students who intend to pursue a degree in Mathematics, Applied Mathematics, Physics, Astronomy, Statistics, or Actuarial Sciences. Topics include: The Mean Value Theorem, techniques of integration, sequences and series, differential equations, parametric equations, and polar curves.

Textbook	Required are <i>Single Variable Calculus: Early Transcendentals</i> , 7th Edn, by James Stewart (Brooks/Cole), along with the <i>Student's Solution Manual</i> . This is the same textbook that was used for Calculus 1000A in the fall term. Text and solutions were sold together as the "Student Value Package."
Reading	At a minimum, students are expected to read the textbook and complete the exercises suggested on the course website. The topics we deal with in this course come from Chapters 4, 7-11 (not necessarily in that order). Students should consult the list of suggested exercises on the course website for more detail.
Course Notes	Some topics will be covered in more detail than is available in the textbook. For these topics students are expected to consult the supplementary course notes available for free on the course website.
